



## COVID-19 CASE PROTOCOL

In an effort to protect our members, staff and guest so that we can remain open, we asked the you adhere to the following protocols surrounding illness during Covid-19 times:

**If you are feeling unwell in any way, please stay home and feel better soon!**

**If you arrive at the JCC and the following occurs:**

**If a temperature of 100.4°F or higher was detected by the health screening OR you reported having a fever, you may not return to the JCC until:**

- You are symptom-free for 72 hours without the use of fever reducing medications or 7 days have passed since the appearance of additional symptoms apart from fever: OR
- You have received negative results of an FDA Emergency Use Authorized COVID-19 molecular assay for detection of SARS-CoV-2 RNA, OR
- You present a doctor's note stating that the fever was not the result of COVID-19, and you do not have COVID-19.

**If you reported coughing or difficulty breathing, or two or more other symptoms of COVID-19 you may not return to the JCC until:**

- You are symptom-free for 72 hours without the use of fever reducing medications AND 7 days have passed since the appearance of symptoms and you have received you have received negative results of an FDA Emergency Use Authorized COVID-19 molecular assay for detection of SARS-CoV-2 RNA: OR
- 10 days have passed since the first appearance of symptoms without an FDA Emergency Use Authorization COVID-19 molecular assay for detection of SARS-CoV-2 RNA.
- If you report having close-contact with someone with suspected or confirmed COVID-19 within the past 10 days, you may not enter the JCC until 7 days have passed since the contact AND you have received a negative test result, or 10 days has passed without a negative test result and you are symptom free.

**If you have been exposed to, diagnosed with, or believe you have, COVID-19, you may not return to the JCC until:**

- 72 hours have passed, and you are fever-free without the use of fever-reducing medication; AND
- You report improved respiratory symptoms (cough, breathing); AND
- At least 7 days have passed since your positive test result and 10 days since the symptoms first appeared and existing symptoms are improving without the help of fever reducing medications.

**If you are traveling whether interstate or internationally, we ask that you adhere to the State of NJ suggested but not mandatory guidelines which states that all travelers should self-quarantine for 7 days and be tested upon returning home 5 days post travel, before resuming regular routines.**
